Gallatin Valley Land Trust (GVLТ) is in support of the proposed 50-year cooperative agreement between Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks and the City of Bozeman for the conservation of resources, maintenance and development of the Glen Lake Rotary Park. GVLТ has worked with the City of Bozeman and Bozeman Sunrise Rotary Club to develop an important trail system within the Rotary Park, on adjoining City property and surrounding private open space areas, including a trail connection to FWP's Cherry River Fishing Access Site.
